Understanding Domestic Abuse and Coercive Control: Breaking the Silence

Domestic abuse, often known as domestic violence, is a deeply concerning issue affecting many relationships. Legal Director, Dipika Mistry, at Solihull-based law firm Shakespeare Martineau explains what it is and how you can get legal support.

What is domestic abuse?

Domestic abuse is a pattern of behaviour used by one partner to maintain power and control over another within a relationship. The behaviour can be physical, emotional, sexual, financial, or digital abuse. It also be controlling behaviour, with coercive control being one of its subtle yet profoundly damaging aspects. It is important to recognize the signs, and importantly, break the cycle.

What is coercive control?

Coercive control is subtle. The abuser may be manipulative, intimidating, and use psychological tactics to dominate their partner. Unlike physical abuse, coercive control operates on emotional and mental levels, making it harder to recognise. Victims can become isolated from friends and family because their partner is monitoring them, or limiting their access to money. They may also doubt their perceptions and feelings because they are being 'gaslighted', which is when the abuser uses manipulation to make victims question their own sanity or powers of reasoning.

What legal advice is available?

There are steps which can be taken to put legal protections such as Non-Molestation and Occupation Orders. A Non-Molestation Order gives protection from violence, threats and intimidation and harassment.

Breaching this order is an arrestable offence and can lead to imprisonment.

An Occupation Order deals with living arrangements within a family home and grants a right to stay in the home, or restricts another family member from entering or living in the same property even if they are a legal owner. This order is especially important in domestic violence situations, as it allows victims and their children to remain in their homes without fear.

Such court orders can be obtained from the Family Court. Legal advice from a family law solicitor is crucial and will help you understand your rights and options fully.

Take action

Domestic abuse and coercive control have no place in a healthy relationship. Understanding the signs, seeking help, and empowering yourself are essential steps toward breaking free from the cycle of abuse. Remember, you are not alone, and there is help available.

How Secure is your Wi-Fi?

ow much thought do you give to vour home Wi-Fi security? Probably not enough. An insecure home Wi-Fi network means that outsiders can easily access it, and as well as using your internet for free, they can exploit it for malicious activities. They could access data on devices connected to that network, including passwords, financial data, personal photos, and confidential documents. Someone could even use your network to engage in illegal activities online which could be traced back to you. Even if unauthorized users aren't enagaina in malicious activity, the added traffic can lead to network congestion, resulting in reduced performance for leaitimate users.

Wi-Fi security might seem daunting, but it's more about taking the right steps than it is about technical complexity. Here are areas where people often slip up:

Setup: Adjusting router settings feels like a chore, but investing a little time now can prevent problems later. Make it a point to familiarize yourself with your router's control panel. **Weak Passwords:** Opt for a robust Wi-Fi password.

Avoid easily guessable



passwords like "password" or "12345678", or your surname!

Default Admin Passwords:

Replace the generic passwords e.g., 'admin', that your router came with to prevent unauthorized access.

Using Outmoded Security
Protocols: Move beyond
outdated encryption like
WEP or even WPA. WPA3 is
the newest standard, so look
for routers that support it.

Enabled Vulnerable Services:

Disable insecure features like Wi-Fi Protected Setup (WPS) and Universal Plug and Play (UPnP), which can be easily exploited. Unnecessary Remote **Access:** Unless essential, turn off remote access to your router to prevent external threats.

Ignoring Guest Networks: Use the guest network feature for visitors to keep them separate from your primary network.

This limits their access to sensitive files and devices.

Smart Devices on Main

Network: Assign smart home gadgets to a guest network. This prevents potential security lapses from affecting your main devices.

NOTE Hiding your Wi-Fi network means disabling the "SSID broadcast" feature on your router, making the network name (SSID) invisible to most users. While it might seem like a smart security measure, there are several problems associated with it:

It can give you a false sense of security, because hiding your SSID doesn't make your network invisible to everyone. People with the right tools or software can still detect hidden networks and their SSIDs.

Also, every time you want to add a new device to your network, you'll need to manually input the SSID and password since the network won't appear in the list of available Wi-Fi connections. This can be inconvenient and troublesome, especially for less tech-savvy individuals.

Most importantly hiding your SSID is not a substitute for implementing robust security measures, such as strong encryption (like WPA3) and a solid password.

Hopefully I've helped you understand a little better how to protect your home Wi-Fi so that you can stream and surf safely.



Pear and Chocolate Pudding Cake



Ingredients

85g butter, plus 1
tbsp extra for tin
85g golden caster sugar,
plus extra for tin
85g gluten-free dark
chocolate, broken
into pieces.
1 tbsp brandy
3 eggs, separated.
85g hazelnuts or almonds,
toasted and ground in
a food processor.
4 very ripe pears, peeled,
halved, and cored.
Icing sugar, for dusting

Method

Grease the sides of a 25cm loose-bottomed cake tin and line the base with baking parchment. Sprinkle in 2 tbsp caster sugar and swirl it around to coat the base and sides, then tip out any excess. Preheat the oven to 180C/fan 160C/gas 4. Melt the chocolate and butter in a bowl over a pan of hot water, remove from the heat, stir in the brandy and leave to cool.

Whisk the egg yolks with the caster sugar in a large bowl until pale and thick; then fold into the cooled chocolate along with the ground hazelnuts or almonds.

In a separate bowl, with a

clean whisk, beat the whites until they reach a soft peak (don't over beat). Stir a spoonful of the whites into the chocolate mix, then carefully fold in the rest of them in. Spoon the mixture into the prepared tin. Level it off, then arrange the pears over the mixture, cut side down. Bake for about 40 mins until the pears are soft and the cake is cooked all the way through. Leave to cool in the tin for five minutes before releasing it, then place on a rack to cool completely.

Dust with icing sugar and serve with crème fraîche.

Thanksgiving What's the story behind America's Iconic Celebration?

very year, on the fourth Thursday of November, Americans gather with friends and family to indulge in a turkey feast Thanksaiving

in a turkey feast. Thanksgiving is one of the most iconic and cherished American holidays. But how did it come to exist?

Thanksgiving can be traced back to 1620 when a group of English settlers, known as the Pilgrims, arrived on the shores of present-day Massachusetts aboard the Mayflower. Fleeing religious persecution from the Church of England, they sought to start a life in the New World. But their first winter in America was brutal and nearly half of the 102 settlers died.

The romanticised history goes that Pilgrims encountered an Enalish-speaking Native American named Sauanto. He and members of the Wampanoaa tribe tauaht the settlers how to fish, cultivate corn, and extract maple from trees. With these skills, the settlers were able to sustain themselves. and in the autumn of 1621. they experienced a bountiful harvest. To express their gratitude and celebrate, the Pilgrims organized a three-day festivity and invited the Wampanoag tribe, including their leader, Chief Massasoit. The feast included dishes made from the harvested



crops, though the meat was probably deer rather than turkey.

In reality, much bloodshed took place both before and after that first feast, and it was Massasoit who negotiated a treaty between the settlers and the Wampanoag tribe, which included an agreement that no member of either group would harm anvone from the other, and that they would leave their weapons at home when trading. This lasted for a decade, with the pilgrims trading **English goods for Wampanoag** land, access to natural resources and other assets.

But tensions began to simmer as 25,000 more European colonizers arrived, claiming rights to land, and bringing with them diseases which decimated the native population. Mistrust between the two groups grew and the Native Americans were viewed as the enemy of the pilgrims, with horrifying consequences.

Although the 1621 feast is recognized as the first Thanksgiving, the practice of celebrating the harvest did

not immediately become an annual tradition. Days of Thanksgiving were held, but they were sporadic and varied in nature: some were religious, others more like parties.

By the 19th century
Thanksgiving began to resemble
the modern national holiday.
Sarah Josepha Hale, the author
of the nursery rhyme "Mary
Had a Little Lamb," played a
pivotal role. She embarked
on a 20-year campaign to
establish Thanksgiving as a
national holiday, lobbying
politicians, presidents, and
other influential fiaures.

In 1863, in the midst of the Civil War, President Abraham Lincoln declared the last Thursday of November as a National Day of Thanksgiving. He hoped the holiday would help unify a nation torn apart by conflict.

Over the years, the traditions and meanings behind
Thanksgiving have evolved and diversified. Today, Thanksgiving is a time for reflection, gratitude, and spending time with loved ones, (though it's important to acknowledge that mistreatment of Native Americans still goes on). It's also a time for parades, football, and Black Friday sales. Yet despite its transformation over the centuries, the core values of 'giving thanks' remain unchanged.


